Previous sailing & race experience is helpful but not absolutely necessary: hard work and effort can overcome lack of experience.

Where Are They Now?

Since 1994 many students have gone through our sailing programs and more recently our high school sailing program. Here's a short update on two TACS folks, one (Anna Frick) a former high school sailor and the other (Wendy Schoeder-Kelly) a former instructor.

Anna recently dropped us a note about life at the University of Michigan. Here's her status:



"I am a sophomore at U of M, majoring in Microbiology with a German minor. U of M sailing is a club sport, which means we're entirely student run and anyone can join and sail with us. We sail on Baseline Lake, which is a small inland lake about 40 min from campus. We don't have a

coach, so more advanced sailors set up courses or run drills. Since this is not a varsity sport, we have a lot of new sailors on the team and do a lot of teaching at the start of the semester. I personally like it a lot, because there's really no pressure this way- some people have been racing since they were little kids and some people started two months ago; and that is all OK. This also gives us a lot of flexibility about practice and regattas. People sign up to go to regattas on weekends when they are free and go to practice when they can. The only 'mandatory' part of being on the team are meetings on Monday nights. The Sailing Team also likes to do non-sailing things together. In the off season, like right now, we play intramural sports like Intertube Water Polo and Soccer. We also have assorted parties and get-togethers as we see fit.

In non-sailing life, I work as a research assistant in a Communications lab running studies and managing data. I volunteer with an Urban Debate program and with an Adaptive Skiing program; both of these are a lot of fun and pretty fulfilling. I'm majoring in Microbiology with the goal of doing grad school here at the School of Public Health."

Wendy Schoeder-Kelly was one of our first instructors. The Kelly part of the name is relatively new, first of all let's offer our congratulations to Michael & Wendy! She remembers TACS when we were teaching out of the old Grand rapids bus that was towed to



the site each spring! Her greatest joy is

seeing some of her former students now instructing for TACS when she returns to Traverse City each summer. Wendy now teaches sailing to adults and students at the North Texas Sailing School on Lake Ray Hubbard in Dallas Texas and is also an elementary school teacher in Dallas.

Thanks to Anna and wendy for their updates! To all our TACS alumni, drop us a note and let us know what you are up to these days!
